In the Battle of Okinawa, Doss went to the aid of four injured men even though he was twenty five feet from enemy lines and being attacked by gunfire and grenades. Another time was when he was caught in an enemy tank attack, he told the litter bears to take a critical injury instead of him. John 15:13 states, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends". Doss was willing to lay down his life for his comrades. I want to be like Desmond Doss to be willing to up my life for God. I want to not give up on people who do not believe in God.

Lastly, he stayed faithful to what he believed during intense pressure. When he was in training camp, his fellow soldiers mocked him for his beliefs, but he didn't care. When they allowed him to have Saturdays off to go to church and honor the sabbath, he had to work more on his other training days than the other soldiers. Doss was a vegetarian. His comrades saw him as inferior and even threatened to kill him, but he still stayed committed to his moral and beliefs. When he had to train with a gun, his officer tried to force him to use him, but he refused and was mocked and punished for it. I want to be able to stay to

what I believe. No matter what is done to me, I want to remain faithful to God and his commandments.

In conclusion, my devotional ideal is Desmond Doss. My dream is to be like him one day. I want to be able to respect life by not harming others with weapons, to help others in need, and stand firm for God. I will be like him and be willing to live my beliefs!
